IN THE MATTER OF AN APPLICATION OF WASHINGTON COUNTY SEEKING AN ORDER FOR EXEMPTION FROM VISUAL IMPACT MITIGATION REQUIREMENTS OF RULE 804

Washington County_("Applicant"), by and through undersigned counsel, hereby files this Application with the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado ("Commission") for an order seeking exemption from the requirements of Commission Rule 804, Visual Impact Mitigation, and in support of its Application states and alleges as follows:

- 1. Production facilities associated with oil and gas operations are located within the Applicant's boundaries in the State of Colorado.
- Rule 801 of the Commission permits any Colorado county, home rule or statutory
 city, town, territorial charter city, or city and county to apply to the Commission for
 an exemption from any or all of the rules and regulations in the 800-Series of the
 Commission's Rules for all or a portion of the lands within its boundaries.
- 3. Applicant seeks an exemption from Rule 804, Visual Impact Mitigation, for all or a portion of the lands within its boundaries as described below:

All lands within Applicant's boundaries (Washington County);

Townships 1 North, 2 North, 3 North, 4 North, 5 North, Ranges 54 West, 53 West, 52 West, 51 West, 50 West, 49 West, and all sections included therein.

Townships 1 South, 2 South, 3 South, 4 South, 5 South, Ranges 56 West, 55 West, 54 West, 53 West, 52 West, 51 West, 50 West, 49 West, and all sections included therein

- 4. Rule 804 requires that production facilities, regardless of construction date, that are observable from any public highway must be painted by September 1, 2010 with uniform, non-contrasting, non-reflective color tones (similar to the Munsell Soil Color Coding System), and with colors matched to but slightly darker than the surrounding landscape.
- 5. Applicant believes that enforcement of Rule 804 is not necessary for the protection of public health, safety and welfare, or the environment on the Application Lands and thus the Application Lands should be exempted from this rule for the following reasons:
 - a) Oil and gas production facilities are not located where they will distract drivers on public highways.

- b) The county is not densely populated, so aesthetics of the tanks and other production facilities are not a concern.
- c) The ad valorem taxes collected from the operators of producing oil and gas wells are an important source of revenue for Washington County. We believe this requirement, which would force most operators to incur additional operating expenses by repainting all or most of their equipment to a uniform tan color, could result in the premature plugging and abandonment of economically marginal producing wells.
- d) The Board of County Commissioners for Washington County as a political subdivision of the state has taken an official position on this matter in February of this year by adoption of Resolution 57-1010 (see attached)
- 6. The names and addresses of the interested parties, according to the information and belief of the Applicant, are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof. [Interested parties in this case are likely to be the surface owner and the operator where the production facilities are located.]
- 7. Applicant requests the Commission to set the Application for hearing and designate the Application Lands as exempt from Rule 804.

RESOLUTION 57-2010

It was moved by Commissioner Johnson and duly seconded by Commissioner Foy to adopt the following Resolution; to wit:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined that it would be desirable to request an exemption from certain regulations adopted by the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission in the interests of the citizens of Washington County; and

WHEREAS, oil and gas production in Washington County is critical to the economy and well being of the citizens; and

WHEREAS; due to the land area of the County being over 2,500 square miles and the population base of approximately 4,926 within the County, the visual impact of oil and gas equipment is negligible; and

WHEREAS; pursuant to the language contained in <u>801</u>. Introduction of the Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC) as adopted on April 1, 2009, this Board may request an exemption from <u>804</u>. Visual Impact <u>Mitigation</u> relating to the repainting of oil and gas equipment a uniform tan color;

Whereas; at a regular Board meeting held on this date the Board has discussed this matter and therefore have determined to take the following action.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY, as follows:

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners hereby formally requests an exemption from the aforementioned Visual Impact Mitigation regulation relating to the repainting of all oil and gas equipment / activities located within Washington County to a uniform tan color.
- 2. The reason for this request is that this Board is of the opinion that enforcement of this rule is not necessary to ensure the protection of health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and residents of Washington County.
- 3. The ad valorem taxes collected from the operators of producing oil and gas wells are an important source of revenue for Washington County. We believe this requirement, which would force most operators to incur additional operating expenses by

repainting all of their equipment to a uniform tan color, could result in the premature plugging and abandonment of economically marginal producing wells.

- 4. Should the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission require any additional supporting documentation in order to grant this exemption, please contact the Washington County Administrator at 970.345.2701.
- 5. The Clerk to the Board is hereby directed to forward this resolution to the GOGCC as soon as possible to show the action taken by the Board on this date.

The foregoing Resolution was presented at a regular meeting of the Washington County Commissioners held on the 16th day of February 2010 by Commissioner Johnson who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Foy and on roll call vote, all votes being yes, the resolution was adopted.
