TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On June 14, 1966, the Commission issued Order No. 197-1, which among other things, established 640-acre drilling and spacing unit, for production of gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Topeka Limestone Formation, with the permitted well to be located within the radius of 1200 feet from the center of the drilling unit, for the below-listed lands:

On November 20, 2006, Spyglass Exploration, LLC, by its agent, filed with the Commission a verified application for an order requesting an exception location to Order No. 197-1, for the drilling of the Ward #1-30 Well at a location 624 feet from the north line and 1552 feet from the east line in the NW¼ NE¼ of Section 30, Township 30 South, Range 45 West, 6th P.M.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to the above, has scheduled the above-entitled matter for hearing on:

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public and to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operations of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

In accordance with Rule 509., any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application or to intervene on the application should file with the Commission a written protest or intervention no later than December 22, 2006, briefly stating the basis of the protest or intervention. Such interested party shall, at the same time, serve a copy of the protest or intervention to the person filing the application. An original and nine (9) copies shall be filed with the Commission (Rule 503.). **Anyone who files a protest or intervention must be able to participate in a prehearing conference during the week of December 26, 2006.** Pursuant to Rule 503.f., if a party who has received notice under Rule 503.b. wishes to receive further pleadings in the above-referenced matter, that party must file a protest or

intervention in accordance with these rules. In accordance with the practices of the Commission, should no protests or interventions be filed in this matter by **December 22, 2006, the Applicant may request that an administrative hearing be scheduled for the week of December 26, 2006.** In the alternative, pursuant to Rule 511.b., if the matter is uncontested, the applicant may request, and the Director may recommend approval on the basis of the merits of the verified application and the supporting exhibits.
