NOTICE OF HEARING

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On March 5, 2012, the Commission issued Order No. 407-563 which, among other things, established an approximate 160-acre drilling and spacing unit for certain lands, for the production of oil, gas and associated hydrocarbons from the Codell-Niobrara Formation. Sections 7, 18 and 19, Township 6 North, Range 62 West, 6th P.M. are subject to this Order for the Niobrara Formation.

On March 5, 2012, the Commission issued Order No. 407-572, which pooled all interests in an approximate 160-acre drilling and spacing unit, for the development and operation of the Codell-Niobrara Formation. Sections 7, 18 and 19, Township 6 North, Range 62 West, 6th P.M. are subject to this Order for the Niobrara Formation.

On April 27, 1998, the Commission adopted Rule 318A, which, among other things, allowed certain drilling locations to be utilized to drill or twin a well, deepen a well or recomplete a well and to commingle any or all of the Cretaceous Age Formations from the base of the Dakota Formation to the surface. On December 5, 2005, Rule 318A was amended to allow interior infill and boundary wells to be drilled and wellbore spacing units to be established. On August 8, 2011, Rule 318A was again amended to, among other things, address drilling of horizontal wells. Sections 7, 18 and 19, Township 6 North, Range 62 West, 6th P.M. are subject to this Rule for the Niobrara Formation.

On July 31, 2012, Noble Energy, Inc. ("Noble" or "Applicant"), by its attorneys, filed with the Commission pursuant to § 34-60-116 C.R.S., a verified application ("Application") for an order to pool all interests in eight approximate 320-acre wellbore spacing units established for the below-described lands ("Application Lands"), for the development and operation of the Niobrara Formation, effective as of the earlier of the date of the Application, or the date that any of the costs specified in C.R.S. § 34-60-116(7)(b)(II) were first incurred for drilling each of the Wells Ranch AE18-63-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35648), Wells Ranch AE18-64-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35650), Wells Ranch AE18-65-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35647), Wells Ranch AE18-66-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35646), Wells Ranch AE18-67-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35645), Wells Ranch AE18-68-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35674), Wells Ranch AE18-69-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35649), and Wells Ranch AE18-69-1HN Well (API No. 05-123-35673), respectively, and to subject any nonconsenting interests to the cost recovery provisions of C.R.S. § 34-60-116(7):

Pursuant to said hearing in the above-entitled matter at the time and place aforesaid, or at any adjourned meeting, the Commission will enter such orders as it deems appropriate to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public and to prevent the waste of oil and gas, either or both, in the operations of said field, and to carry out the purposes of the statute.

In accordance with Rule 509., any interested party desiring to protest the granting of the application or to intervene on the application should file with the Commission a written protest or intervention no later than September 17, 2012, briefly stating the basis of the protest or intervention. Such interested party shall, at the same time, serve a copy of the protest or intervention to the person filing the application. An original and 13 copies shall be filed with the Commission. Anyone who files a protest or intervention must be able to participate in a prehearing conference during the week of September 17, 2012. Pursuant to Rule 503.g., if a party who has received notice under Rule 503.b. wishes to receive further pleadings in the above-referenced matter, that party must file a protest or intervention in accordance with these rules. In accordance with the practices of the Commission, should no protests or interventions be filed in this matter by September 17, 2012, the Applicant may request that an administrative hearing be scheduled during the week of September 17, 2012. In the alternative, pursuant to Rule 511., if the matter is uncontested, the applicant may request, and the Director may recommend approval on the basis of the merits of the verified application and the supporting exhibits.
