Greetings:

Accompanying should be a "red line" which should be loadable onto our COGIS map.

Within the larger rectangle (encompassing the Parachute Creek valley from just north of Parachute all the way up to EnCana's land in T5S) is a smaller one, which is the area of the previous red-line I sent last week.

I could provide a paper/hard-copy – with compressors and other landmarks more easily identified.

There is a "Legend" on the red-line, which has letter designations for S Lindauer's house (A), compressor stations B through M, and numbers for 7 locations I took sound measurements at.


A: S Lindauer residence	B: Roan Cliffs G.P.	C: Hay Barn G.P.	D: Callahan

M: Middle Fork			


1. I re-took sound meas. about 350' south of Roan Cliffs yesterday. I noted 46 dBA, 68 dBC (wind under 1 mph).
 #s 2 & 3 are the west/southwest locations I took meas at last week.
4. I went about 350' east of both Hay Barn and Roan Cliffs, across C R 215 and got: 57 dBA, 73 dBC (wind < 1). Note that this location is in a sort of "bowl"/valley.
5. 350' west (across P Creek) from Hay Barn. 51 dBA, 73 dBC (wind up to 2 mph).
6. about 350' south/southeast of Callahan. 52 dBA, 73 dBC (wind < 1).
7. 350' north (NW) of Callahan. 59 dBA, 79 dBC (wind up to 3 mph). Note: there was a constant "hum" from the former American Soda Plant – about 400' to the NE.


More notes: Mr. Lindauer's list of compressors had 9 units – B, C, D, E, F, H, I & J above. His list had "Crawford", which is up above Garden Gulch, "up top." It could be that the "Jangles" unit (K on my list) could be what he meant. I also included 3 more: the EnCana Middle Fork plant, a smaller compressor up Starkey named "Ajax," and Wheeler (Gulch).
