The Colorado Division of Wildlife (CDOW) has reviewed the permit application for the above-referenced Oil and Gas Facility located within SW quarter of the SE quarter of Section 2, Township 8 South, Range 96 West, Garfield County. Based on the presence of mule deer critical winter range CDOW has prepared a list of operating standards and conditions of approval (COAs) specific to the subject location (see Attachment). CDOW recommends that these provisions be incorporated into your permit as COAs to minimize impacts to wildlife resources.

If you have questions about the operating standards and COAs that we have provided, please contact our Energy Liaison to discuss alternative measures and Best Management Practices that could be implemented at the location. Otherwise, please return a signed copy of the Attachment to our office by July 28, 2009. If we have not heard back from you by this date, we will forward the Attachment to the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (COGCC) for incorporation into your permit.

Note that COGCC's regulations require surface owner consent for some operating standards and some permit-specific wildlife COAs. If you have questions, please contact Land Use Specialist, Michael Warren at 970-255-6180. We look forward to working with you for the benefit of wildlife.

Conditions of Approval Noble Energy Inc. Hyrup 2-34B

On Thursday, July 16, 2009 CDOW staff – Land Use Specialist - talked by phone to Ms. Kate Shirley of Noble Energy Inc. CDOW informed Ms. Shirley that the Hyrup 2-34B permit was located in mule deer critical winter range and that CDOW was recommending to COGCC timing limitations as a condition of approval. The timing dates talked about were December 1 to April 15.

Mule Deer Critical Winter Range

- Where oil and gas activities must occur in mule deer critical winter range or elk winter concentration areas, conduct these activities outside the time period from December 1 through April 15.
- Restrict post-development well site visitations to between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. and reduce well site visitations between December 1 and April 15 in mule deer and elk winter range.
- Establish company guidelines to minimize wildlife mortality from vehicle collisions on roads.
- Close and immediately reclaim all roads that are redundant, not used regularly, or have been abandoned to the maximum extent possible to minimize disturbance and habitat fragmentation.
- Avoid aggressive non-native grasses and shrubs in mule deer and elk habitat restoration.
- Reclaim mule deer and elk habitats with native shrubs, grasses, and forbs appropriate to the ecological site disturbed.
