Pursuant to the variance granted by the Commission on September 29, 2009, Chevron U.S.A. Inc. submits notice that it has completed its business and technical analysis and will install a vapor recovery unit at Collection Station No. 47 to reduce the facility's potential to emit VOCs above five tons per year in compliance with Rule 805.b(2)B. Materials will be procured this spring so that construction of the facilities can be completed this summer. The vapor recovery unit will be fully operational no later than October 1, 2010.

Chevron also confirms that, as required by the variance, it has sent a letter to each resident within one-quarter mile of Collection Station No. 47 describing the control equipment upgrades to the produced water tank that will be installed to comply with Rule 805.b(2)B and stating that the controls will be installed no later than October 1, 2010, pursuant to the conditions of the variance.
