Margaret,

We have a total of 8 form 18/18a beginning on 7/12/10 through 10/4/10. In addition 1 Noav has been issued on 7/14/10 Doc # 200262245 due to odor coming from the Watson ranch pad in battlement mesa. Antero responded with corrective actions to control odor. After the Noav was issued, the complaints seemed to become more physical in nature, such as watering eyes, skin irritation for example. All complaints were concentrated in the same neighborhood located by the St. John Elementary school.

During the course of this investigation I checked the water supply watering the school facility's and checked flow back operations located near battlement mesa and being conducted by EnCana and Laramie II during this same time frame. I was not able to see any evidence of fluid, spray, or mist leaving the Watson ranch pad site. I thought I would see a pattern of dead or dying vegetation if this was the case and never witnessed any issues with vegetation. I spent several hours searching for any type of odor during the middle weeks of July, and did notice a slight odor on a couple of occasions, but I could never follow the odor to the Watson ranch pad. As a resident of battlement mesa, I can attest to the presence of rogue odors during the summer months for the last couple of years, and before the Antero activity of this past summer. I felt that I needed to follow the odor to the source to be sure that the odor was tied to the Watson ranch pad.

The complaints have been handled by Mike Longworth, Jay Krabacher, or myself during the stated time period. The complaints were from a group of 4 to 5 residents of battlement mesa. I am aware that complaints were made by different means and to different agencies, however this E-Mail represents the response that has been documented in our data base.
