

**Antero Resources – Piceance Basin Operations  
On-Site Safety & Security Services  
Daily Safety/Security Observations and Actions**

**Summary of actions:**

- Provided on-site safety services at Watson Ranch location.
- Provided on-site security services at Watson Ranch location.
- Provided JSA reviews and feedback for flowback operations, completions rig, nitrogen foam operations, wireline operations.
- Met with Matt Honeycutt to review job scope and Antero expectations.
- Per COGCC Rule 912(e), and request by Garfield County Dispatch, call to dispatch to advise of flaring status was made by John Flahie.
- Placed Area PID monitor back in service after overnight charging.
- Horse round up: Four of the Gardner family horses were outside the fence and walking / grazing along the County road when I arrived for work this morning. I instructed our security guard to phone the Gardners while I flagged traffic to warn other motorists of the hazard. I assisted in the round up with the Gardners both from my vehicle and on foot. The round up took one hour; the horses ran about one mile away from home. Yee Haw.
- Trespasser: At 1047 hours, a black Chevrolet truck, California license plate 8N81490, drove onto the lease road and parked at the security guard's position. A male stepped out of the vehicle and raised a camera to his face. The security guard informed the man that he was on private property and that the company preferred that he did not take photos while on the property. The man stated that he could "...take pictures if I want to". The security guard informed the man that he was welcome to take photos as long as he was not on Antero-controlled property and asked the man to please leave the property. The security guard phoned me and informed me of the situation. I responded to the gate just as the vehicle was backing out of the lease road onto the County road. The vehicle was blocking the entire County road at this time. The man raised his camera to his face while inside the vehicle before departing the area. The vehicle was not seen again as of 1745 hours.
- Neighbors burning garbage: At 1745 hours, I observed Mrs. Gardner place trash bags in a 55-gallon drum and ignite them on her property Southwest of the well pad. Weather conditions were such that the smoke from the fire hung low to the ground and drifted down slope to the Northeast. My opinion was that the odor from the burning garbage was offensive.
