The COGCC is reviewing the Form 2A (#400140684) for the Pine Ridge Triggerfish 22-31 location, located in the SENW Sec 31 T19S R69W Fremont County, Colorado. The COGCC requests the following changes regarding the data submitted on or attached to the Form 2A prior to passing the Oil and Gas Location Assessment (OGLA).

- Location Drawing: The location drawing shows the distance to one of the three roads in the 400 foot improvement radius.
- Please update the location drawing with the distances to roads 657C and 645C.
- COAS:
 - Due to the likely hood of oil being received in the pit and exceeding 10,000 ppm TPH an approved Pit Permit (Form 15) will be required prior to pit construction. The form 15 shall include a pit management plan.
 - The operator shall install a stop sign at the intersection of the lease road and the public road. The operator shall be responsible for enforcing the stop sign with all employees and contractors.
