Dear Ms. Blieszner:

Commission technical staff has reviewed Encana's response to Notice of Alleged Violation # 200332536 ("NOAV") dated December 12, 2011 which includes your Simple Answer to NOAV, dated January 9, 2012, and a submittal of technical analysis and sampling information under cover letter dated August 9, 2012 from Christopher Hines, Encana Environmental Field Cordinator/Natural Resources Specialist.

Based on the sampling information presented, Commission technical staff agrees with Encana's conclusion that the high arsenic values giving rise to the NOAV are likely the result of high, naturally occurring arsenic levels in the native soils and their parent material, and not necessarily the result of an unreported spill.

Pursuant to Rule 522.b.(1), staff has concluded that the alleged violations did not occur and the NOAV is hereby revoked. This NOAV is now closed. No further action by Encana is necessary.
