Before the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado:

In the matter of the investigation to take measures to present the waste of oil and gas in the "J" sand of the Leader field, Adams County, Colorado.

Clause No. 59

NOTICE OF HEARING

To all interested persons and to whom it may concern:

Notice is hereby given, that the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado upon its own motion has set the above entitled matter down for hearing on Tuesday, February 21, 1956. Time: 10 a.m. Place: 330 State Office Building, Colfax Avenue and Sherman Street, Denver, Colorado. On the eighth day of March 1955 the Commission issued its order No. 59-1 which provided in part that the Leader field be shut in for a period of six months during which time the operators were to jointly test and study the field in an effort to determine the most efficient method of producing the known oil and gas reserves in the "J" sand pool of the Leader field.

As a result of the hearing in this cause which was held August 24, 1955, the Commission issued its order No. 59-2 which extended the effective period of order No. 59-1 for an additional six months commencing September 8, 1955. All operators and owners of working interest are hereby requested to appear at the hearing as set forth above, and to submit recommended rules and regulations with supporting testimony for governing the production of oil and gas from the "J" sand pool of the Leader field in the most efficient manner. It is suggested that operators confer with each other, so that recommended rules and regulations as are hereby sought may be presented jointly.

Pursuant to said hearing in the above entitled matter at the time and place aforesaid or at any adjourned meeting the Commission will enter such order as it deems appropriate to prevent the waste of oil or gas, either or both, in the operation of said field and to carry out the purposes of the statute.
