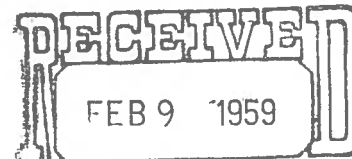

NOTICE OF CONTINUATION
OF HEARING
CAUSE NO. 26
BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS
CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF

IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMUL-
GATION OF FIELD RULES TO GOV-
ERN OPERATIONS IN THE "J"
SAND OF THE ADENA FIELD, MOR-
GAN COUNTY, COLORADO
TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND
TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On February 19, 1957, the Commission issued its Order No. 26-34, which, among other things, permits and authorizes The Pure Oil Company, as Unit Operator of the Adena "J" Sand Unit, to conduct pressure maintenance operations by the injection of water in the "J" sand of the Adena Field. On February 4, 1958, Order No. 26-38 was issued, which permitted said Unit Operator to drill new wells or recompleat old wells for injection of water in order to extend pressure maintenance operations, such wells being Wells No. W-1 to W-7, and W-24 to W-32, all inclusive.

On January 19, 1959, The Pure Oil Company, as Operator of the Adena "J" Sand Unit in said Adena Field, filed with the commission an application for an order permitting Applicant to continue pressure maintenance operations in said Adena "J" Sand Unit by injecting water into the "J" sand formation through additional wells W-33, W-34, and W-35.
