

BEFORE THE OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF COLORADO
IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN OPERATIONS IN THE "J" SAND OF THE ADENA FIELD, MORGAN COUNTY, COLORADO.
TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:
On February 16, 1960, the Commission issued its Order No. 26-49, which provides, among other things, for a maximum daily allowable production, during any one month, of 20,000 barrels of oil and 25,173,000 cubic feet of gas, from the "J" sand pool of the Adena Field.
On May 9, 1960, The Pure Oil Company, as Operator of the Adena "J" Sand Unit in the Adena Field, Morgan County, Colorado, filed with the Commission an application for an order determining the present maximum efficient rate of production of oil and gas from the Adena "J" Sand Field, establishing the allowable daily quantities of oil and gas to be produced from said field in accordance with such MER determination, and allocating such total field production among the separate producing leases in the field; and for such other and further relief as the Commission shall determine proper in this matter.
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that The Oil and Gas Conservation Commission of the State of Colorado, pursuant to said application, has set the above matter for hearing on:
