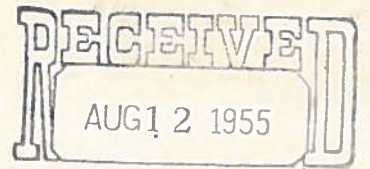

IN THE MATTER OF THE PROMULGATION OF FIELD RULES TO GOVERN THE SPACING AND DENSITY OF GAS WELLS IN THE GREENWOOD GAS FIELD IN BACA COUNTY, COLORADO.

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS AND TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On July 5, 1955, the Cities Service Gas Development Company filed with the Commission a petition for an order to amend Order No. 34-1 by extending the area of the Greenwood Gas Field, Baca County, Colorado, the additional area to be spaced the same as in said Order No. 34-1, and to include the following described lands:

Township 33 South, Range 41 West 6th P. M. All of Sections 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33.

Township 34 South, Range 41 West 6th P. M. All of Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34.

Township 35 South, Range 41 West 6th P. M. All of Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 15, 16, 17 and 18.
