Actual length may be longer (see below), which would result in an even higher capital cost.

Pipeline would be laid from Allen well to State 33-15 well (distance of 10,085 feet), with a JT unit placed at location of State 33-15 well, then another pipeline from JT unit to tie-in at NE SE Sec 13 T6N R91W (distance of 11,252 feet).

Average pipeline length for each well:

$$\frac{(10085 + 11252)}{2} = 10,669 \text{ ft}$$
