Alex,

I have a few updates and proposed path forward for you on the RWF 342-22 (bubbling well) project (this is not the DOE & CDPHE project).

My updates are:

- I talked to our engineering department and they informed me that, to their knowledge, this project was closed with the COGCC engineering department (Kevin King). We don't have an official closure email from Kevin, but based on our internal emails, there are no outstanding issues or remedial actions that were requested by Kevin; the shallow Wasatch gas is still venting.
 - Olsson re-sampled the three groundwater wells that were installed for this project and the results are ND on BTEX. There are hits on methane but there is no COGCC threshold for it.
 - I searched through the COGCC website and noticed that the natural attenuation request/closure letter from Gretchen was never uploaded into the COGCC website. (As a reminder for you, the RWF 342-22 summary that I provided during our October meeting is shown below with the submittal from Gretchen highlighted in yellow)
- My proposed plan is to revise the letter that was submitted from Gretchen to include the most recent sampling event and resubmit that letter with a Form 4 requesting closure of this incident. Does this seem like an approach that would work for you? Engineering seems to have taken it off the books, and I think the sample results we've collected have indicated that there is no impact to the environment, so I'd like to clear this off of our environmental plate, too, if possible. Feel free to give me a call if this proposal is confusing or if you'd like to discuss.
