Afternoon Rick, during a recent inspection you completed at our former Vetting 24-24 tank battery that was washed away by the flooding activities, you noted in the inspection that we needed to provide containment for a portable tank that we had placed at the site. Your inspection number is 667400290. We are currently plugging and abandoning the well associated with this battery and are using the tank to store non-potable water to be used during the plugging activities. We are not storing any condensate or oil in this tank or any water laden with petroleum hydrocarbons. Being that non-potable water is in this tank, do we still need to have containment around this tank? You stated you wanted this corrected by November 15<sup>th</sup>.
