As discussed in our January 28, 2014 meeting, Marathon will not meet the March 3, 2014 Form 15 extension deadline for completion of all outstanding Form 28 actions and intends to continue operating the 32C Pond within all other COGCC regulations with COGCC oversight. Marathon proposes to submit to you on a weekly basis an e-mail that provides the status of pending actions and a timeline for working through the Garfield County Limited Impact Review process. This week's actions are as follows:

Status of COGCC Facility ID #433736 - (February 15-21)

- 1) Garfield County Limited Impact Review – Marathon and Olsson & Associates participated in a conference call with Garfield County Planner, Glenn Hartmann on February 20<sup>th</sup> to discuss the status of Marathon's application, and determine what is needed to resolve the access and roadways issue. Glenn reported that Marathon's application appears to be complete except for the roadway issue. He will be meeting with his boss next week to try to obtain a resolution to the issue. Marathon will be requesting via e-mail, a formal response from Garfield County on whether the road issues relating to Garden Gulch Road and Garden Gulch Extension Road can be managed separate from the 32C LIR application. Marathon and Olsson & Associates are continuing to work on options to meet the intent of the Garfield County Land Use Code as it pertains to the roadway issues.
- 2) There were no environmental or safety events (incidents, near misses or good catches) this week at the facility.
