I checked those coordinates, they are correct. That is a very big, almost pond sized, pit. I suspect that it might have been a mud pit that was then probably used as a production pit. Its actually way bigger than the regular production pits that I am used to. It is heavily vegetated with trees and brush in the pit and along the banks. It has probably been 20-25 years since it was used. The current landowner is interested in signing some type of document asking us to leave it as is since it has such verdant growth in and around it. He felt that that would be preferable to reclaiming it and then having to deal with the new scar and the re-vegetation process.
