Kris,

Thanks for getting in touch. I don't know when we last updated you, but we've made some progress since our conference call.

We took a small rig out and drilled some holes in an effort to find the bottom and the perimeter. I've attached the e-mail from Carl discussing the specifics of the drilling and the results. Ultimately, we found the bottom at a reasonable depth, so we decided to continue removing soil rather than exploring in situ remediation.

Since then we've continued to dig and haul, and the updates I get from Carl are promising, but we're still not there yet. He can see the contaminated layer and he's pursuing it. He's telling me that he thinks we can be ready to take samples for lab analysis by the end of April. At the moment we're running 4-5 belly dumps each day, so we're hauling quite a bit of dirt, there's just a lot that needs to be hauled.

As far as a timeline for completion of the project, I'm hoping to have soil removal completed by the end of April and analytical samples sent to the lab the first part of May. Assuming a ten day turnaround, clean results, and some time for approval of the supplemental form 27 I'll file with the results, I'd like to begin backfilling in mid-May. If all goes to plan, I'd like to be filing to request closure of the form 27 in early June. At that point we would begin final reclamation of the entire location, including the small production pit associated with the tank battery. I'd like to discuss that with you sometime in the near future. I'll file a form 27 on it and we'll get it cleaned up to the 910-1 tables, but I want to get one finished before we start the other.

I'll be headed up there next week to check in on it and follow up on some of Emily's inspections. Feel free to give me a call if you'd like to come out and have a look and discuss it. I think I'll be on location on Wednesday the 15th.
