

Notes from 6/5/2015 meeting requested by COGCC staff for project update on remediation project 8333

Phone meeting attendants: COGCC staff; Kris Neidel, Alex Fischer Grynberg staff; Clay Houser and Jannie Keidel

Items discussed:

- Grynberg staff indicated that they had discovered what hopes to be a confining clay layer that is shallow to the south and dives down to the north
- Uncontaminated overburden will be removed (stockpiled on location) to remove (for disposal) contaminated soil below.
- It is believed that contamination follows the confining layer
- Stock piles of soil on location mentioned in 6/1/2015 inspection are clean fill
- COGCC requested operator: submit an amendment to project 8333 describing additional pit excavation, pit facility id 100601.
- The water in the excavation of pit facility id 100600 will be evacuated; if water does not recharge it will be disposed of properly and assumed to be stormwater. If water re-charges it will be reasoned that water is groundwater; in this instance Grynberg staff will notify COGCC staff and an evaluation of the project will take place, a water sample should also be taken at the time of water evacuation.
