OGLA	kubeczkod	<p data-bbox="383 130 649 163">GENERAL SITE COAs:</p> <p data-bbox="383 193 1360 310">Notify the COGCC 48 hours prior to start of pad construction, rig mobilization, spud, and start of hydraulic stimulation operations using Form 42 (the appropriate COGCC individuals will automatically be email notified, including the LGD for hydraulic stimulation operations).</p> <p data-bbox="383 340 1360 394">Operator must implement best management practices to contain any unintentional release of fluids, including any fluids conveyed via temporary surface pipelines</p> <p data-bbox="383 424 1360 667">Operator must ensure 110 percent secondary containment for any volume of fluids contained at well site during drilling and completion operations; including, but not limited to, construction of a berm or diversion dike, diversion/collection trenches within and/or outside of berms/dikes, site grading, or other comparable measures (i.e., best management practices (BMPs) associated with stormwater management) sufficiently protective of nearby surface water. <p>Construction</p>	<p>Structures for perennial or intermittent stream channel crossings should be constructed using appropriately sized bridges or culverts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>* Design road crossings of streams at right angles to all riparian corridors and streams to minimize the area of disturbance to the extent possible.</li> </ul>
