Carlos,

I have not received any response from Mustang, other than Chuck Dobie, per a phone conversation on May 18, 2016, stating how do I know it was them that sprayed and caused the damage. As I explained to you, I have irrigation water for a short period of time (days,) and I need to get that water on the field while it is available. I value that water at \$1000.00 per day in lost production to my crops. It has been sixteen days now that I could have irrigated, but since I do not know what they sprayed, I can not risk the damage to my fields. I want you to know my situation, so that you can ask Mustang to respond. The way I look at it... a simple phone call would have given them the information on what was sprayed, when it was sprayed, and that a licensed contractor was responsible. But yet again they continue to punish me for turning them in for damages. So I feel loss of use of my irrigation water should be considered along with the clean up of the damaged area.
