OGLA	kubeczkod	<p>SITE SPECIFIC COAs:</p> <p>The drilling pit, if constructed, must be lined, or a closed loop system (which operator has indicated on the Form 2A) must be implemented during drilling. All cuttings generated during drilling with OBM/high chloride mud must be kept in the lined drilling pit, or placed either in containers or on a lined/bermed portion of the well pad; prior to analysis and/or offsite disposal.</p> <p>The moisture content of any drill cuttings in a cuttings pit, trench, or pile shall be as low as practicable to prevent accumulation of liquids greater than de minimis amounts.</p> <p>The access road will be constructed to prevent sediment migration from the access road to nearby surface water or any drainages leading to other nearby surface waters.</p> <p>Operator must implement best management practices to contain any unintentional release of fluids, including any fluids conveyed via temporary surface or buried pipelines.</p> <p>Operator must ensure secondary containment for any volume of fluids contained at well site during drilling and completion operations; including, but not limited to, construction of a berm or diversion dike, diversion/collection trenches within and/or outside of berms/dikes, site grading, or other comparable measures (i.e., best management practices (BMPs) associated with stormwater management) sufficiently protective of nearby surface water. Any berm constructed at the well pad location will be stabilized, inspected at regular intervals (at least every 14 days), and maintained in good condition.</p> <p>Flowback and stimulation fluids must be sent to tanks, separators, or other containment/filtering equipment before the fluids can be placed into any pipeline or pit located on the well pad or into tanker trucks for offsite disposal. The flowback and stimulation fluid tanks, separators, or other containment/filtering equipment must be placed on the well pad in an area with additional downgradient perimeter berming. The area where flowback fluids will be stored/reused must be constructed to be sufficiently impervious to contain any spilled or released material.</p>	09/19/2011

Wildlife	<p>Greater Sage-grouse</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Quicksilver will construct the pad and drill the well outside of the period between March 1 and May 15 – lekking season. 2) Quicksilver will conduct post-development well site visitations to between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and reduce well site visitations between March 1 and July 30 – lekking and brood rearing period. Emergencies exempted. 3) Quicksilver will construct and or drill any subsequent wells outside the period between March 1 and May 15. 4) Quicksilver will use hospital grade mufflers for compressors, pump jacks or other motors necessary to run operations at the site. Mufflers will be pointed upward to dissipate potential vibration. 5) Interim and final reclamation will match existing vegetation. 6) Quicksilver will include a weed management plan and implement the plan as part of reclamation. <p>Mule Deer, Elk, & Pronghorn</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Where oil and gas activities must occur in mule deer critical winter range or elk winter concentration areas, conduct these activities outside the time period from December 1 through April 15. 2) Restrict post-development well site visitations to between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. and reduce well site visitations between December 1 and April 15 in mule deer and elk winter range. 3) Establish company guidelines to minimize wildlife mortality from vehicle collisions on roads. 4) Gate single-purpose roads and restrict general public access to reduce traffic disruptions to wildlife. 5) Close and immediately reclaim all roads that are redundant, not used regularly, or have been abandoned to the maximum extent possible to minimize disturbance and habitat fragmentation. 6) Avoid aggressive non-native grasses and shrubs in mule deer, elk, and pronghorn habitat restoration. 7) Reclaim mule deer, elk, and pronghorn habitats with native shrubs, grasses, and forbs appropriate to the ecological site disturbed. 8) Restore appropriate sagebrush species or subspecies on disturbed sagebrush sites. Use locally collected seed for reseeded where possible.
