In response to this NOAV I have the following comment.




Gentlemen:

Due to low prices and small cash flow, priority was given to the repair of our UIC well in Washington County, Colorado.

We did however in July have a rig in the area, set a cast iron bridge plug over the J Sand with cement and commenced testing D Sand intervals. Currently the well is scheduled to be swabbed and gas pressure noted to evaluate either further completion methods or plugging and abandonment.
