Hi Jorge,

I spoke with Noble and they have visible impacts to snow and ice in the creek. This creek has been reconstructed into an irrigation ditch. Noble has shut the well in and the release is not active. Noble has deployed absorbent booms both at the release point and downstream. It does not sound like the release has impacted surface water beyond the immediate area. I can provide an update later tomorrow after my site visit.
