Kyle,

I need to supply the COGCC with positive confirmation that Elbert County will in fact allow disposal of the drill cuttings on site. EastCo will be separating the cuttings from the drilling fluid, then the drilling fluid will re-used in a closed-loop system and ultimately disposed of offsite per COGCC Rule 907 d. The drill cuttings will be temporarily staged in a container, soil samples will be collected to confirm compliance with applicable COGCC Table 910-1 standards, after compliance is confirmed, the cuttings will be pushed into a pit and buried a minimum of 3 feet below ground surface with topsoil. Please confirm that this practice is allowed by the county under the MOU. Feel free to call if you have any questions or concerns you would like to discuss.
