

## **Public Comments**

The following comments were provided by members of the public and were considered during the technical review of this application.

1	<p>My neighbors and I DO NOT approve this location. It is far too close to our homes in Northridge as well the Rue de Trust neighborhood. We are currently filing complaints with Crestones WBS, Morgan Hill, and their completion site located</p> <p>inbetween. We are also looking into hiring an attorney regarding the nuisance and disruption from these sites. My recommendation would be to move the proposed location substantially away from these residential neighborhoods of which have already been frustrated by large-scale existing drilling operations.</p>	06/14/2017
2	<p>This location is much too close to Northridge. Sound mitigation will not be effective, as we have experienced with the Woolly-Becky location, which has produced numerous complaints to COGCC, Erie Police Department, and the Erie Board of Trustees. Northridge email lists are filled with comments and strategies to counter proposed drilling near us that keep us awake at night, pollute our air, and otherwise effect our quality of life.</p> <p>It should be noted that a break in the sound wall for an access road will significantly reduce sound mitigation, particularly in low frequencies produced by drilling.</p> <p>Sound mitigation for drilling should be at 50db/55db for residential areas when the drilling locations are so close to residential areas, rather than the industrial 80db level. The industrial 80db level approximates the sound of a garbage disposal, dishwasher, average factory, freight train (at 15 meters). Car wash at 20 ft (89 dB); propeller plane flyover at 1000 ft (88 dB); diesel truck 40 mph at 50 ft (84 dB); diesel train at 45 mph at 100 ft (83 dB). Food blender (88 dB); milling machine (85 dB); garbage disposal (80 dB). Exposure for eight hours causes hearing loss. The 80db limit has proven to be</p> <p>unacceptable at Woolley-Becky.</p>	06/14/2017
