I just wanted to recap the progress Samson Resources made on the GOVT 1042 well that we reclaimed earlier this year.

Initially we found there was contaminated soil on the site that was placed on a pit liner. The soil and pit liner was hauled to the Wray Gulch landfill at the end of the summer. We then recontoured the location, then seeded and fenced the location off to help in revegetation.
