WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Pursuant to compliance with Colorado Oil and Gas (COGCC) Rule 907, Nickel Road Operating LLC (Nickel Road), plan outlines Nickel Road's general plan for handling and disposal of all Exploration and Production Waste, including drilling cuttings, drill fluids and produced fluids. Nickel Road will adhere to all stipulations under COGCC Rule 910.

E&P wastes onsite will be stored in compatible containers or containment devices designed or engineered for the purposes for which they will be utilized. These containers will be inspected on a regular basis to ensure that no undue wear, structural issues, severe rust, other defects, which may impact their effectiveness.

E&P wastes will be transported offsite via truck by a licensed transporter to a licensed third-party solid waste disposal facility/landfill. Frequency of these operations will vary by site based on waste volumes.

Any soils contaminated by E&P waste will be disposed of at a licensed third-party solid waste disposal facility/landfill. Tank bottoms will be disposed of at licensed third-party solid waste disposal facilities.

Liquid wastes such as flow-back fluid and produced water will be disposed of at licensed third party injection facilities such as those run by NGL Water Solutions.

Nickel Road will keep records of all E & P waste that is transported off-site for a period of not less than five (5) years. These records will satisfy the requirements of COGCC Rule 907.b.(2). If requested, Nickel Road will provide copies of these records to the COGCC.
