Thank you for working to resolve the stormwater issue. The reclamation group inspections with stormwater issues are generally based on installation of controls in accordance with good engineering practice. Generally we do not receive any specific information from the operators on the stormwater planning up front. The CDOT or Urban drainage would be a good source for sizing sediment traps. Chris mentioned to me that the rest of the stormwater controls looked suitable at the time of his inspection.

Given current the weather challenges we will extend you CA date to 3-9-2018
