St. Croix Operating Inc. hereby certifies that it has complied with Rule 306.e, which states that an Operator shall be available to meet with Building Unit Owners who received an OGLA notice or a buffer zone notice pursuant to Rule 305.c. and requested a meeting regarding the proposed oil and gas location. The operator sent notices pursuant to Rule 305.c on May 10, 2018, and as requested has met several times with the Surface/BU Owner, and expressed 2 requests: 1. To not remove topsoil for site construction, and 2. To re-route the planned access road to the well pad. A Sundry will be submitted requesting the access road change once the Form 2 & 2A permits are approved. Topsoil will not be removed and the planned drilling rig is on wheels and is adjustable for leveling which allows for no topsoil removal requirement.
