On Friday 09/21/2018 at approximately 11:35 am, a tank on the C26NW caught fire while being prepared for cleaning. Everyone on location immediately evacuated and 911 was called. EMS arrived on location and were able to put the fire out (~12:16pm). The fire department foamed the other three tanks to cool them down. Fluid had been drained from the tank. Gas monitors were in use. The wells were shut in and will remain shut in until repairs are made.

Cause of ignition is still under investigation. The most likely cause at this point appears to be static discharge or a spark created by metal on metal contact as the tank heater was being removed.
