1	<p>This proposed location lies on an intense archaeological area near the edge of the Chalk Bluffs. I have been monitoring the area for 50 years. The existing Highball #1 well just to the north disturbed archaeological remains. Artifacts can be seen on the disturbed area around the well. In addition the form 2A contains several factual errors. In the Plant Community section the area is referred to as "disturbed cheatgrass" is in actuality native grass rangeland. Also, under Water Resources, the nearest down-gradient is listed as Easton (actually Eaton) Canyon 2553 feet to the southeast. However about 800 feet to the south west is the Chalk Bluff rim. A tributary to Eaton Canyon heads up below this rim per USGS topo maps.</p> <p>Locating a well on this location is not advisable due to the likelihood of encountering archaeological remains, disturbing an increasingly rare native grassland, and nearness to a environmentally important wildlife area of the Chalk Bluffs.</p>	10/08/2018
