Dear Ms. Murphy,

Extraction Oil & Gas, Inc. (Extraction) hereby certifies that it has complied with Rule 306.e, which states that an Operator shall be available to meet with Building Unit Owners who received an OGLA notice or a buffer zone notice pursuant to Rule 305.c. and requested a meeting regarding the proposed oil and gas location. The operator sent notices pursuant to Rule 305.c, and received a request from Steve and Miriam Holley for a meeting on 9/27/2018. Extraction met with Steve Holley, Miriam Holley and their friend Rob Brueske on 11/8/2018.

**Attendees included:** Steve Holley, Miriam Holley, Rob Brueske, Jason Maxey (Weld County LGD), Representative Mike Foote (House District 12), Chandler Newhall (Extraction), Johanna Ostrum (Extraction) and Patty Varra (Extraction).

The buffer zone building unit owners, Steve and Miriam Holley requested a consultation with Extraction in response to the OGLA notice they received to discuss impacts they can expect and how Extraction intends on mitigating them. Their specific concerns were noise, odors, air quality, project timeframe and operating hours, water usage and disposal, traffic, emergency response, spills and potential health impacts. To begin addressing their concerns, Extraction and Jason Maxey explained the basics of COGCC, Weld County and CDPHE regulations so that they might understand the framework under which oil and gas locations are required to operate. Extraction explained how these regulations mitigate their specific concerns about noise, odors, air quality, water usage and disposal and spills. They were also given a list of Extraction's BMPs filed with the Form 2A so they were aware of our specific plans to address their concerns in addition to what the regulations require. Furthermore, Extraction went on to explain the WOGLA application process during which traffic plans and emergency response plans are coordinated with and then approved by the local authorities. At the conclusion of the consultation, the Holley's seemed as satisfied as they are going to be. They requested that Extraction provide them with minutes from the meeting, copies of the Weld County Code and a direct Extraction contact for any future issues – Extraction agreed and supplied on all accounts.

Extraction has complied with Rule 306.e and respectfully requests that the Director approve the subject wells. Should you have any questions or concerns please contact the undersigned at 720-354-4607.
