INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

A subsurface assessment will be conducted and soil samples will be collected to determine if hydrocarbon impacts to the subsurface media exist from a former earthen produced water pit.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

Five soil borings will be advanced to approximately 10 feet below ground surface at the former pit location. The borings will be continuously field screened using a photoionization detector (PID). A soil sample will be collected from each boring from the interval with the highest PID reading. In the absence of any elevated PID reading, a soil sample will be collected from the total depth of each boring. The soil samples will submitted for total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and total xylenes (BTEX), pH, and specific conductivity (EC). The analytical results will be compared to Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commissions (COGCC) Table 910-1. If EC exceeds the COGCC allowable level, the sample(s) will be further analyzed for sodium absorption ratio. The analytical results will be provided in a supplemental Form 27.
