INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Two partially buried produced water vessels (PWVs) were removed at the UPRC H 17-24 location on September 11, 2018. Groundwater and impacted soil were not encountered in either of the PWV excavations. A liner was not present beneath the PWVs at this site. The PWVs at this facility have been permanently removed. Soil samples were submitted for laboratory analysis, to determine if a release occurred. The general site layout, soil sample locations, and PWV excavation dimensions are depicted on the Sample Location Map provided as Figure 1.

Proposed Soil Sampling

On September 11, 2018, following removal of the PWVs, soil samples were collected from the sidewalls and base of the two excavations. The soil samples were field-screened for volatile organic compounds using a photoionization detector (PID). Soil samples B01@5' and B02@6' were submitted for laboratory analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and total xylenes (BTEX), total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) – gasoline range organics (GRO) by EPA Method 8260C, TPH diesel and oil range organics (DRO and ORO) by EPA Method 8015, pH, and electrical conductivity (EC). Laboratory analytical results for soil samples B01@5' and B02@6' indicate that BTEX, TPH, pH, and EC concentrations and levels were in full compliance with COGCC Table 910-1 allowable levels. The soil sample analytical results are summarized in Table 1, and the laboratory analytical report is attached.

Laboratory results indicate that soil samples B01@5' and B02@6' were in full compliance with COGCC Table 910-1 allowable levels, therefore, no soils were removed. The excavation area was backfilled and contoured to match pre-existing site conditions.

REMEDIATION SUMMARY

Laboratory results indicate that soil sample concentrations were in compliance with COGCC allowable levels. Groundwater was not encountered in the PWV excavation. Based on the analytical data presented herein, assessment is complete at this site and no further activities are required. Upon COGCC approval of the Initial Form 27, Kerr-McGee will submit a Supplemental Form 27 request for a No Further Action (NFA) determination for this site.

	Soil sample analytical results indicate that the pH of soil in the vicinity of the tank bottom is 11.2 which is outside of the Table 910-1 Allowable Level of 6-9. The electrical conductivity (EC) of soil appears to comply with the Table 910-1 levels. Additionally, BTEX and total petroleum hydrocarbons of the soil are in compliance with the Table 910-1 Allowable Levels. Therefore, COGCC will not require further action at this time. However, should future conditions at the site indicate contaminant concentrations in soils exceeding COGCC standards or if groundwater or surface water is found to be impacted, then further investigation and/or remediation activities may be required.
