Remediation of impacted soils will be completed onsite using an ex-situ oxidative process to efficiently remove organic contaminants from impacted soils. This process ultimately breaks down organic contaminants into carbon dioxide and water.

Equipment will be mobilized to the site and staged for excavation and processing. Impacted material will be loaded into soil screening unit via excavator, using a special shredding bucket as needed. Impacted material will be conveyed by screening unit and chemical treatment will be applied simultaneously. Chemical solutions will be blended on site and conveyed to screening unit via hoses.

Material will be stacked by screening unit into piles of up to 300-500 cubic yards.

Processed piles will be allowed reaction period of 1 to 7 days.

One composite sample per 300-500 cubic yards will be taken from the processed soils and sent to a third party laboratory for final analysis.

When lab data is received showing contaminant reduction to below 500 ppm TPH, the soil will be used for backfill into the excavation.

Samples will be collected periodically from the sidewalls and floor of the excavation area to dictate continued excavation.

When all sidewalls and floor samples are below 500 ppm TPH, backfilling and compaction will proceed.
