
DST #1: 4389-4440, open 26 minutes, no shut-in. Recovered 1260' muddy water, slightly gas cut. Good blow of air immediately, diminishing and died after 20 minutes. Then mud level fell and tool was pulled. F.P. 740. Hydrostatic 2630.

DST #2: 4499-4507, open 30 minutes, shut-in 15. Recovered 2' drilling mud. Weak blow of air, died in 5 minutes, picked up and reopened tool, faint blow and died. F.P. 0. B.H.P. 0. Hydrostatic 2840.

Enclosed is the requested field print of the Schlumberger. When possible the complete report will be forwarded to you. The report on the #1 Colorado is waiting on a Johnson Tester final report.
