A total of twenty six (26) grab soil samples were collected as part of site investigation and excavation activities. All soil samples were delivered to a certified lab under proper chain of custody procedures and analyzed for TPH-DRO, TPH-GRO, BTEX and Naphthalene by EPA Methods 8260B and 8015

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

☒ Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, analyses, and locations of samples):

A total of fifteen (15) groundwater monitoring wells were installed during the initial site investigation. Groundwater samples were collected from twelve (12) monitoring wells and transported to a certified lab under proper chain of custody and analyzed for BTEX by EPA Method 8260B. Three (3) monitoring wells had detectable LNAPL and were not sampled as part of the initial site investigation.
