2	<p>COGCC website is still not transparent or public friendly. Clicking your link to a map does not show me where this is in the city of Aurora. Where is Eastern Hills 4-65 17-18 3AH located on a street map?</p> <p>In spite of the Colorado Assembly's decision to make the COGCC focus on public health, safety, welfare, environment, and wildlife -- this website is still set up to make it impossible for an everyday citizen to comment knowledgeably.</p> <p>Even if there are no streets at the proposed well location, a big enough street map with enough details of neighborhoods, schools, businesses, rec areas, public lands, waterways, etc. would be a good indicator for comments on location.</p> <p>Without this information, how can I compliment you on a job well done? How can I say that if I don't know whether the site is a mile from school property lines, 2500 feet or 1200 feet or 1 block away?</p> <p>So all I can do is start by saying, the typical emergency evacuation radii is 2,500 feet from property lines of residences, schools, and businesses. In case of emergency, there should be at least 2 roads leading out of an area -- neither of which should bring people closer to the well site or heavy industrial facility. Etc.</p>	02/04/2020
