Prior to implementing corrective actions the Rio Blanco County Weed Control Supervisor was contacted to develop suitable strategies to address the management of noxious and undesirable species (primarily Halogeton and Cheat Grass).

Following consultation with the county weed control supervisor, actions completed include removing roadbase gravel from former pad surface, harrowing the area to remove noxious weeds prior to them going into seed this season, installing a nutrient rich compost amendment to promote desirable growth, and broadcast seeding a mix consistent with the regional vegetative species.

Additionally, a sterile barley was selected as an additive seed to the mix. The sterile barley was utilized because of its tendency to germinate quickly and crowd out noxious weeds prior to them propagating, which will allow additional time for the desirable species to germinate and spread. All actions were agreeable and/or recommended by the weed control supervisor.
