INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

This form has been prepared to summarize assessment activities conducted during the plugging and abandonment of the Riverbend 21-24 wellhead and the status change of the associated off-location flowline from active to out-of-service. The Form 27 Initial (Document No. 402599381) indicated the flowline would be permanently removed; however, the scope of work for the flowline changed during abandonment activities to a status change to out-of-service. Assessment activities began on April 1, 2021. Soil and groundwater assessment activities were conducted in accordance with COGCC Rule 911.a.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Soil samples were collected from the wellhead excavation and the separator riser. The samples were field screened for total volatile organic compounds using a photoionization detector (PID). Based on a low PID reading at the separator riser, the soil sample was not submitted for laboratory analysis. Based on low PID readings from the base and sidewalls of the wellhead excavation, only base sample B01@5' was submitted for laboratory analysis. Analytical results indicated soil was in full compliance with Table 915-1 standards, with the exception of arsenic, barium, selenium, and SAR. However, background soil sample BG01@5' indicated these levels are naturally elevated in the soil. Therefore, further excavation was not warranted. The wellhead excavation and separator riser sample locations are depicted on Figure 1 and Figure 2, respectively. The soil sample results and PID readings are summarized in Table 1 and Table 2, respectively. The laboratory analytical reports are attached.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Groundwater was encountered in the base of the wellhead excavation. Groundwater sample GW01 was collected for laboratory analysis of COGCC Table 915-1 analyses. One background groundwater sample (BG01-GW01) was collected and submitted for Table 915-1 inorganic parameters. Based on the laboratory analytical results and the comparison to the background concentrations of inorganic parameters, groundwater concentrations for sample GW01 were in full compliance with Table 915-1 standards. The excavation groundwater sample and background groundwater sample locations are depicted on Figure 1. The groundwater sample results are summarized in Table 3. The laboratory analytical report is attached.

Following cut and cap operations, a soil gas survey was conducted. Four soil vapor points (SVP01 through SVP04) were installed adjacent to the former wellhead location. A fifth soil vapor point could not be installed in the wellhead excavation due to the presence of groundwater at the base. Field screening was conducted using a GEM 5000 gas meter. No methane was detected adjacent to the wellhead, and the soil vapor points were subsequently abandoned. The soil vapor point locations are illustrated on Figure 2. The soil vapor point field measurements are summarized in the attached field form.
