Other Potential Receptors within 1/4 mile

The seasonal Empire Intake Canal is within 1/4 of a mile of the well. The Monitoring Well (DWR Receipt 0050692, Permit 50692-MH) approx 745-ft to the NE is the nearest permitted water well. This well was permitted to 30-ft, was never constructed, and no static water level was recorded. Monitoring Hole (DWR Receipt 0062052, Permit 62052-MH) is approx 1515-ft to the NE. This well was constructed to 13-ft, no static water level recorded. Residential Well (DWR Receipt # 0224203, Permit 125383-A) is approx 1665-ft NW. This well was constructed to 80-ft, static water level recorded at 31-ft. Groundwater less than 20 ft is not expected at the disturbance location. This location is not within 1/4 of a mile of a HPH area.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

Grab confirmation soil samples will be collected from beneath the above ground oil tanks, water vault, and separator. A grab confirmation soil sample will be collected from beneath the produced water vault as well as from the side wall that indicated the highest field screening levels. Soil samples will be analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons), organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. All samples collected will be analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved COGCC laboratory analysis methods.
