There is no piping or equipment associated with this well remaining on the location. Following plug and abandonment activities, the location will be prepared for final reclamation.

As part of the "cut and cap operations", Caerus will excavate the KENNON #1 (API# 05-0-05155) wellhead. Caerus will visually inspect and field screen the base and sidewalls within the wellhead abandonment excavation. Caerus will also visually inspect and field screen any areas of potential impacts discovered during final grading and reclamation. There is no evidence of equipment on location. If field screening indicates impacts to soil in any of these locations, the sample exhibiting the highest degree of impacts based on field screening will be collected from the associated area and submitted for laboratory analysis of the full list of constituents listed in COGCC Table 915-1. Any impacted soil will be segregated, stockpiled on site, and the extent of impacts will be investigated through additional excavation and confirmation soil sampling. Continued in "Additional Investigative Actions" below.
