INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

Wellhead cut and cap operations were completed at the Starck 1 wellhead on April 1, 2021. Groundwater was encountered in the cut and cap excavation at approximately 11 feet below ground surface (bgs). Visual inspection and field screening of soils around the well and the associated pumping equipment was conducted following wellhead cut and cap operations, and soil and groundwater samples were submitted for laboratory analysis to determine if a release occurred. Laboratory analytical results indicated that pH impacts to soil were present at the former wellhead location. As such, a Form 19-Initial Supplemental Spill/Release Report (COGCC Document No. 402648384) was submitted on April 6, 2021, and the COGCC issued Spill/Release Point ID 479761. The associated flowline was removed on April 12, 2015. A topographic Site Location Map showing the geographic setting of the site location is provided as Figure 1. Soil and groundwater sample location and field screening data is presented in Table 1. The wellhead soil and groundwater sample and field screening locations are illustrated on Figure 2. The flowline field screening locations are illustrated on Figure 3.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

On April 1, 2021, a soil sample (WH-B01@8') was collected from the base of the cut and cap excavation at approximately 8 feet below ground surface (bgs). The soil sample was submitted for laboratory analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, and TPH - gasoline range organics (GRO: C6-C10) by USEPA Method 8260D, TPH - diesel range organics (DRO: C10-C28) and oil range organics (ORO: C28-C40) by USEPA Method 8015D, pH, specific conductance (EC) and sodium adsorption ratio (SAR) by saturated paste method, and boron by hot water soluble soil extract method. Analytical results indicated that pH impacts were present, and additional excavation activities were conducted. On June 17, 2021, five (5) soil samples were collected from the final lateral and vertical extents of the excavation area and submitted for laboratory analysis of pH. Analytical results indicated that the pH results collected from the final extents of the excavation area were in compliance with the COGCC Table 915-1 standard.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, analyses, and locations of samples):

Groundwater was encountered in the wellhead cut and cap excavation at approximately 11 feet bgs. On June 17, 2021, a groundwater sample (GW01) was collected from the excavation and submitted for laboratory analysis of BTEX, naphthalene, 1,2,4- and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene (TMB), by USEPA Method 8260D. Analytical results indicated that constituent concentrations in sample GW01 were in compliance with COGCC Table 915-1 standards. The groundwater sample location is illustrated on Figure 2 and groundwater analytical results are presented in Table 4.

Additional Investigative Actions

Additional alternative investigative actions described in attached Site Investigation Plan (summary):

Between April 1 and 12, 2021, visual inspection and field screening of soils was conducted at 4 sidewall locations in the wellhead excavation area, 4 locations at the ground surface adjacent to the excavation, and 9 potholes prior to flowline removal. Based on the inspection and screening results, hydrocarbon-impacted soil was not observed at the soil screening locations. As such, no soil samples were submitted for laboratory analysis from these locations in accordance with the COGCC Operator Guidance for Oil & Gas Facility Closure document. Soil sample location and field screening data is presented in Table 1. Soil analytical results are presented in Tables 2 and 3. Groundwater analytical results are presented in Table 4. The soil and groundwater sample and field screening locations are illustrated on Figures 2 and 3. The laboratory analytical report is provided as Attachment A. The field notes and a photographic log are provided as Attachment B.

The background soil sample was submitted for laboratory analysis of the Soil Suitability for Reclamation Parameters using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in Table 915-1. Analytical results for sample WH-BG01@8' are presented in Table 3.

SOURCE REMOVAL SUMMARY

On June 17, 2021, approximately 70 cubic yards of impacted material were excavated and transported to the Front Range Landfill in Erie, Colorado for disposal. The excavation area was subsequently backfilled and contoured to match pre-existing site conditions.

REMEDICATION SUMMARY

Describe how remediation of existing impacts to soil and groundwater is to be accomplished (i.e. summarize remedial action plan). Laboratory data indicate that impacted soils in the excavation area have been remediated to be in compliance with the COGCCC Table 915-1 standards. Laboratory results indicate that constituent concentrations in the groundwater sample (GW01) collected from the wellhead cut and cap excavation were in compliance with COGCC Table 915-1 standards. Based on the analytical data presented herein, assessment is complete at this site and no further activities are required. As such, Kerr-McGee is requesting a No Further Action (NFA) determination for this location.
