INITIAL ACTION SUMMARY

Description of initial action or emergency response measures take to abate, investigate, and/or remediate impacts associated with E&P Waste.

This form has been prepared to provide prior notice of the partial closure of the Millensifer Fed 37N O SA Facility. In accordance with COGCC Rule 911.a., soil samples and a groundwater (if present) sample will be collected following removal of six above ground storage tanks (AST) and three emission control devices (ECDs) to determine if soil and groundwater (if present) meet the concentration levels of COGCC Table 915-1. Field screening of soils will be conducted during equipment removal activities. The topographic Site Location Map showing the geographic setting of the site is provided as Figure 1.

PROPOSED SAMPLING PLAN

Proposed Soil Sampling

Will soil samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, type (grab/composite), analyses, and locations of samples):

Following the facility removal operations, discrete grab soil samples will be collected from beneath the ASTs, ECDs and associated piping. The soil samples will be field screened for total volatile organic compounds using a photoionization detector (PID). If impacted soils are encountered, a soil sample will be collected from the area exhibiting the highest degree of impact based on visual, olfactory, and/or field screening observations. Soil samples will be submitted (as applicable) for laboratory analysis in accordance with the COGCC Operator Guidance Rule 911.a.(4). Soil samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in COGCC Table 915-1. The proposed soil screening and sampling locations are depicted on Figure 2.

Proposed Groundwater Sampling

Will groundwater samples be collected as part of this investigation? (Number, analyses, and locations of samples):

If groundwater is encountered during equipment removal activities, a minimum of one grab sample will be collected as soon as practical. Groundwater samples will be submitted to an accredited laboratory for analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, total xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, 1,2,4-trimethylbenzene, and 1,3,5-trimethylbenzene, using standard methods appropriate for detecting the target analytes in COGCC Table 915-1.

If no impacts are observed following removal of the equipment, soil samples will be submitted from the locations as applicable under COGCC Operator Guidance Rule 911.a.(4) for laboratory analysis of benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and total xylenes (BTEX), naphthalene, and total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) - gasoline range organics (GRO: C6-C10) by United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Method 8260D, TPH - diesel range organics (DRO: C10-C28) and oil range organics (ORO: C28-C40) by USEPA Method 8015D, pH, specific conductance (EC) and sodium adsorption ratio (SAR) by saturated paste method, and boron by hot water soluble soil extract method. If impacts are encountered, the soil samples will be submitted for laboratory analysis of the full COGCC Table 915-1 analytical suite.
