E&P waste material, associated with Spill ID 200063899, has been collected and stored at the Solid Waste Storage Facility (Facility ID 445769). Removal of the E&P waste material is necessary prior to request for closure of the facility. Associated E&P waste has been removed from location and disposed of at the Walden Land Treatment Facility (Facility ID 427373).

The total horizontal and vertical extent has not been established. Extent of impact will be based on limits of final excavation. Grab samples will be collected from the excavation area, three (3) from the floor and two (2) from each wall of the excavation area. Each collected sample will be analyzed for TPH-GRO, DRO & ORO (EPA Method 8215), and BTEX (EPA Method 8260). Final vertical and horizontal extent of the excavation will be based on results from collected grab soil samples from the excavation walls and floor. All soil Samples will be analyzed for TPH-GRO, DRO & ORO (EPA Method 8215), and BTEX (EPA Method 8260) and verified complaint with COGCC Tale 910-1.

Following the removal of the E&P waste pile, grab samples will be collected to verify the no contamination was left over from the removal of the soil. Analysis for grab samples included TPH -DRO & GRO, BTEX, pH, EC, and SAR.

Excavation activities will resume June 2021 to remove remaining impacted soils from excavation area. Sampling activities will be conducted no later than July 1, 2021 to assess remediation progress. If samples are verified compliant with COGCC Table 910-1, request for closure of the remediation project will be submitted. If additional excavation is necessary based on results of collected samples, final excavation activities will be conducted during July 2021. Resampling will be conducted following the conclusion to final excavation activities.
