The South Platte River located ~ 300' to the N/NE is a surface water feature within 1/4 mile of this location.
The Aquatic Native Species Conservation Waters, CPW State Wildlife Areas and State Parks, and Mule Deer Severe Winter Range are all within the 1/4 mile buffer of this proposed active work area.
The closest water well with a static water level recorded is DWR Receipt number 9061801, which is ~ 4325' to the W. The static water level is 28ft, but the elevation of this water well is ~ 10 ft higher, so there could potentially be groundwater within 20 feet of the surface at the North Platte 44-11-28HZ oil and gas location.

Grab confirmation soil samples were collected from beneath the above ground tanks, separator, and meter house. Additional soil samples were field screened for possible impacts. Soil samples were analyzed by a certified laboratory for TPH (total volatile [C6-C10] and extractable [C10-C36] hydrocarbons), organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1, and EC, SAR, pH, and boron. Eight (8) confirmation samples were collected for TPH, organic compounds in soil per COGCC Table 915-1 adjacent to soil with concentrations greater than COGCC Table 915-1 standards. 19 confirmation samples were collected for pH analysis adjacent to pH values greater than COGCC Table 915-1 standards. One confirmation sample was analyzed for metals adjacent to historical petroleum hydrocarbon impacts observed during the facility decommissioning assessment.

All samples collected were analyzed by a certified laboratory using approved COGCC laboratory analysis methods.
