Dear Mr. Roberts:

Oxford Exploration is planning to drill a wildcat well in Section 23 of T12N, R52W, Logan County, Colorado. Section 23 is a "short section" which adjoins the Colorado-Nebraska state line. By regulation, the Colorado Oil and Gas Commission cannot approve a drilling location within 600 feet of the state line without agreement of the adjoining state's oil and gas commission.

We enclose a map showing four prospects which Oxford proposes to drill during this fall which are based on seismic data. As shown on the map, the optimum location for one of the wells is 1980 FEL and 300 FNL of Section 23. As you know, these structural features are small and we would like to drill the optimum location to reduce our risk as much as possible. The mineral ownership across the state line is common and we submit a lease from the Meier Company and assignment to Oxford along with a title memo on the Nebraska portion and a title opinion on the Colorado portion. The lease outline is shown in yellow on the map.

Oxford requests the Nebraska Oil and Gas Commission's concurrence such that Oxford can apply to the Colorado Oil and Gas Commission for a permit to drill the Meier well 300 feet from the state line. We have had an informal discussion with the staff of the Colorado Commission in which they indicated that with your concurrence they would consider our application for this location.
